Off-Campus Safety

As part of curricular requirements for classes or for volunteer opportunities, SUNY Geneseo acknowledges that students will be required to travel to off-campus sites. As with on-campus activities, student safety is of utmost concern, and while SUNY Geneseo cannot guarantee that non-ideal situations will not arise when traveling off-campus for class or class related activities, it is recommended that students take all possible safety precautions. These include, but are not limited to:

- Know the environment of your travel. It is strongly recommended that students obtain and verify accurate directions to and from their destinations, as well as take a test drive during daylight hours.
- · Travel with a companion whenever possible.
- Bring a print-out of the name and address of the facility, as well as the name and phone number of the faculty supervisor.
- · Let someone on-campus know the location you are travelling to and the times you will be away.
- · Always carry identification with you.
- · Have any cell phone easily accessible and turned on while driving.
- Take note of emergency/pay phones in the area where you have parked.
- · Park in well-lit, heavily populated areas. Avoid alleys, vacant lots, wooded areas, and other shortcuts.
- · Avoid leaving valuable items visible in your car.
- · Always roll up windows and lock car doors before leaving the car.
- · Walk with others to and from your vehicle whenever possible.
- Carry your keys in your hand when walking to your vehicle. One key should be placed between your middle fingers to prevent it from being dropped or jarred loose.
- \cdot Check the area around/under your car and the back seat before entering the car.
- · Lock all doors immediately after entering the car.
- · Walk on the sidewalk whenever possible. Avoid doorways, bushes, and other potential hiding places. If walking in the street, walk facing traffic.
- Walk confidently and at a steady pace. Always look as though you know where you are going, walking quickly and confidently. Avoid making eye contact with strangers.
- Keep your purse/bag securely under your arm. Do no walk with your wallet/money in plain view. Do not wear excessive/expensive jewelry or carry unnecessary cash.
- \cdot Wear clothing that provides for freedom of movement, including comfortable shoes. Consider keeping a man's hat in the car to wear if you will be driving at night.
- · If you notice someone suspicious, leave the area immediately and do not go to your car. Call 911 from an alternate location.
- · If involved in a minor collision in an isolated area, drive to a well-lit, populated place before stopping to assess damage.
- · If you are being followed while driving, do not go home. Drive to the nearest police station, open store, or service station for help. If you are fearful of exiting your vehicle, blow your horn to draw attention to yourself.
- · Never hitchhike or pick up hitchhikers.

Above all, students are strongly recommended to be aware of the people and area around them. To be as prepared as possible, students should complete the following checklist before leaving for any off-campus volunteer or participation activities:

Off Campus Checklist

- ✓ I have my off-campus destination assignment printed out, with all contact details.
- ✓ I have printed directions to and from my destination (through a map or contact person).
- \checkmark I have contact information for the site and know what to do if I get lost.
- ✓ I know a place in the area where I can go should I feel unsafe and/or have a contact person I can call.

Please be advised that SUNY Geneseo generally:

- · Cannot guarantee or assure the safety of participants or eliminate all risks from off-campus activities.
- Cannot monitor or control all the daily personal decisions, choices, and activities of individual participants.
- · Cannot prevent participants from engaging in illegal, dangerous, or unwise activities.

 \cdot *Cannot* assume responsibility for actions or events that are not part of the program, or that are beyond the control of the sponsor and its subcontractors, or for situations that may rise due to the failure of a participant to disclose pertinent information.

How to Document Your Clinical Experiences

It is important to keep track of your clinical experiences so that you can easily and accurately report these experiences when it is time to apply to the Pre-Health Committee and professional health schools. We recommend keeping a journal for yourself that includes the following information for each experience:

- · Experience type (e.g., volunteering, shadowing, internships, clinical research, etc.)
- · Name of medical professional (if applicable)
- · Professional's contact information (e.g., phone, email)
- \cdot Name of facility
- \cdot Location
- · Start and end dates
- · Approximate number of hours per week
- · Total number of hours
- · Brief description

It is often helpful in your description to be detailed about what you observed, or about what your specific responsibilities were and briefly comment on what you learned or gained from the experience. Below are a few questions to help you reflect on your experiences.

Questions for Reflection:

- 1. What did you learn about the ______ of _____ as a result of this experience?
- 2. What did you learn about yourself (strengths/weaknesses, interests, skills, values)?
- 3. Did this experience change your views/understanding of health care in the US (or abroad) in any way?
- 4. How did this experience prepare you for a career in healthcare?
- 4. What did you find most rewarding about your experience? Most challenging?
- 5. Were there any interesting/memorable events or patients that you want to be sure to remember? (Be sure to exclude names to maintain privacy).
