RESEARCH DEVELOPMENT & SCHOLARLY SUPPORT

Funding for a wide variety of activities

Proposal Writing Support Awards provide full-time faculty members with time and other forms of support to write major proposals for submission to external funding agencies. Faculty members may request a course reassignment or other funding to support the writing of either: 1) new proposals, or 2) significant revisions of previously submitted proposals. Support will be considered for major proposals in all academic fields and for a variety of initiatives (e.g. fellowships, research grants, educational grants). A “major” proposal is defined as one requesting a total of \$15,000 or more in support from the sponsor. Funded by the Geneseo Foundation.

DEADLINES: September 16, 2024; February 17, 2025

Research Development Awards support a wide variety of needs associated with developing research and scholarly projects leading to proposals to external sponsors. Funds may be requested for equipment, supplies, software, services, or research assistants. The maximum award is \$1,000 or release time from one course. Funded by the College.

DEADLINES: September 2, 2024; January 27, 2025

Incentive Grants are intended to encourage and support faculty initiatives in research and fund pilot studies, completion of manuscripts, data analyses, bibliographic or archival searches, and creative work. Travel to archives, libraries, and laboratories is also supported. Awards are limited to \$1,000 but faculty may request an additional \$500 to support the costs of involving a student in the proposed project (maximum award of \$1,500). Funded by the Geneseo Foundation.

DEADLINES: September 2, 2024; January 27, 2025; April 28, 2025

SUMMER FELLOWSHIPS

To establish a research program or complete a significant project

Presidential Summer Fellowships provide new faculty with an opportunity to participate in creative activities or establish an ongoing research program. It is expected that the result of this fellowship work will form the basis, in some disciplines, for a larger project for which external funds are eventually sought. *Tenure track faculty employed five or fewer years at the College and who are returning for the following year are eligible. Prior recipients of this award are not eligible.* The \$3,500 awards are funded by an allocation from the President. Recipients who submit a grant proposal to an external agency within one year of the fellowship period will receive an additional \$500 award for research expenses.

DEADLINE: February 3, 2025

Geneseo Foundation Summer Faculty Fellowships and the Roemer Summer Faculty Fellowship support the research and creative projects of Geneseo faculty who are tenured. These fellowships are intended to enable completion of a significant project or to embark in a new direction. It is expected that the scholarly progress of this work, in some disciplines, will lead to external funding. Awards may be used for a stipend and/or support for expenses. Faculty members become eligible for the Geneseo Foundation Summer Faculty Fellowship and Roemer Summer Faculty Fellowship if they have received formal notification of tenure from the President. *Five years must elapse (application to application) before previous recipients are eligible to reapply.* Applications for both fellowships will be considered in one pool. The highest-ranked application will be awarded the \$5,000 Roemer Summer Faculty Fellowship and the next highest-ranked applications will be awarded the \$4,000 Geneseo Foundation Summer Faculty Fellowships. These fellowships are funded by the Geneseo Foundation and by an endowment gift to the Geneseo Foundation from the late Dr. Spencer Roemer.

DEADLINE: February 3, 2025

PRE-TENURE FACULTY RESEARCH SUPPORT GRANTS

In an effort to assist tenure-track faculty whose research and scholarly work has been impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic, the Research Council has established a small grants program for tenure-track faculty who have not yet submitted their tenure package. All tenure-track faculty members who have not yet submitted their tenure package are eligible for a base amount of \$250. Requests for awards up to this amount will be reviewed and approved on a rolling basis. In their application, faculty may also request up to an additional \$250 if needed, but these extra requests may be reviewed and voted on by the Research Council. Awards will be limited to \$500 per person until the two established deadlines have passed. If funds remain after the second deadline, an additional call for applications will be issued and all pre-tenure, tenure-track faculty will be able to apply, even if they have already received the \$500 maximum.

DEADLINES: September 30, 2024, February 24, 2025

TRAVEL

Travel to disseminate scholarly work

Faculty Travel Grants are awarded to formal participants at professional meetings, conferences, showings, or performances. Participation is defined as presenting a paper or poster, organizing a session, serving as a discussant, or giving an invited performance or gallery showing. Funded by the Geneseo Foundation.

DEADLINES: September 2, 2024, for fall travel; January 27, 2025, for spring travel; April 28, 2025, for late spring/summer 2025 travel

ALLOCATIONS

Research Discretionary Allocations support activities leading directly to external fundable projects. Funding is provided for expenses connected with the development of proposals, including communication and travel to meet with sponsor representatives and other costs of research development. Funded by an allocation from the President. Request from the Director of Sponsored Research.

Page Charge awards cover some costs of faculty publications in journals with page, reprint or other

charges. Request from the Director of Sponsored Research.

Indirect Costs Return Awards return part of the indirect costs recovered the previous year to the principal investigator or project director. Funds are to be used for research expenses not covered by budgeted costs.

Matching Funds for various grant programs are arranged through the department chair and the Office of the Provost. Project directors are advised to make arrangements for matching funds well in advance of the application deadline.

Applications and proposals for grants, contracts and fellowships to external agencies, foundations, and companies must be submitted through the Office of Sponsored Research and require prior approval from department chair and other administrators. Grant and contract funds (and some fellowships) are administered through the Research Foundation for SUNY, according to Board of Trustees policy.

SEMESTER/SUMMER GRANTS

Stipend support for research

Dean Johnston and Geneseo Foundation Student Research Assistantships provide faculty members with paid research assistance for their scholarly projects. Students work with individual professors for ten weeks during the academic year and receive a stipend of \$1,000. The Dean Johnston Assistantship is funded by an endowment established by CPAC, Inc. Geneseo Foundation Assistantships are funded by the Geneseo Foundation.

DEADLINES: October 21, 2024 for spring 2025; March 31, 2025 for fall 2025

Geneseo Foundation Undergraduate Summer Fellowships provide a stipend, \$3,000 for two consecutive summer months or \$1,000 for three weeks, for students to undertake a research or creative project under the direction of a faculty member. Funded by the Geneseo Foundation.

DEADLINE: February 17, 2025

Jason and Diana Kyrwood '95 Student/Faculty Research Endowed Fellowship in Honor of Ellen Kintz provides \$2,500 (\$500 is also provided by the Geneseo Foundation to make the total award \$3,000) for an undergraduate student to work with a faculty member in the social sciences on an existing faculty research project. Recipients must devote two consecutive summer months to the project. **DEADLINE:** February 17, 2025

Dr. Wendell and Barbara Rhodes Research Award Provides supplemental funds of \$600 for research or field study. All applications to the Geneseo Foundation and Kyrwood Undergraduate Summer Fellowship programs (February 17th deadline) will be considered. Preference will be given to research that combines a natural science and a social science and may be used for any research-related expenses, including student stipends.

SCHOLARLY ACTIVITY

Support for travel, research and creative activity

TRAC - Travel, Research and Creativity Grants support student research, creative activity, and conference travel in conjunction with a faculty member. Students may apply twice each year, beginning with the summer deadline. Maximum awards are \$600 per student per semester or summer (\$1,800 maximum per group of three or more students working on the same project). **All students must attend one TRAC Grant Workshop per academic year in order to be eligible to apply.** TRAC grants are funded by the Student Association and the Geneseo Foundation. Graduate student grants are funded by the College.

DEADLINES: September 9, 2024; October 28, 2024; February 10, 2025; April 14, 2025

Dr. Denise Battles and Dr. Michael Mills Endowment for Student Research Awards recognize exemplary applications to the TRAC Grants program. All applications to the TRAC Grants program will be considered for these awards, which will be given instead of a TRAC Grant. Similarly to TRAC Grants, maximum awards are \$600 per student per semester or summer (\$1,800 maximum per groups of three or more students).

Sorrell Chesin '58 Research Award provides financial support to recognize students who have successfully undertaken a research experience in the physical and natural sciences or related disciplines under the direction or mentorship of a faculty member in the field of study.

DEADLINE: December 9, 2024
